

CHEN XINGYUN

Whispers of dreams

On Wednesday 10 July 2024, from 6.30 pm, Antonio Battaglia Gallery is pleased to present a solo show dedicated to the young Chinese artist Chen Xingyun.

On display the recent work born through the classic modeling of the figure and life drawing made with the most innovative techniques of Chen's artistic research at the end of her studies at the two-years specialistic sculpture course at Brera Academy of Fine Arts.

"In the composition **Whispers of dreams**, which Xingyun presents in this exhibition at **Antonio Battaglia Gallery**, the realism of sculptural forms acquires a symbolic and narrative value.

The girl, naked, in the middle of the room, moves slowly but soon realizes that she is being watched, with no escape; the two old men hide but their eyes protrude, cupid to enjoy the view of the young woman; the fearful lover flees, The Angel (of Good and Evil), from above, observes the scene.

Putting the sculptures in relation to each other, the 'staging' of the representation, made through the movement of looks and the accurate arrangement of the works in the gallery's space, evokes a story of Old Testament, *Susanna e i Vecchioni.*"
